Somewhere In The Middle

Is this background information really all that important?

Only if we want to genuinely understand what we're reading in Scripture! Here's a principle worth remembering:

The Bible can never mean what it never meant.

Scripture can't have some unique, esoteric meaning to me personally that is completely divorced from its historical and cultural setting. It can't mean something to us now that it never meant to them then.~Curt Parton

4. How Do I Respond?
